

TOWN OF AYLMER VOTES 2018

MUNICIPAL AND SCHOOL BOARD ELECTION INFORMATION

The Town of Aylmer approved the use of Internet and Telephone Voting procedures with Council's passing of By-law No. 16-17 on May 1, 2017. This means that in the 2018 Municipal and School Board Elections, voters will be able to vote from any location, 24 hours per day with an available internet connection on computers, tablets and cellphones. Telephone voting will also allow voters to call and cast their vote from any touch-tone dial pad. Eligible voters may also attend the Voter Help Centre.

Voter Information Letters (VIL) will be sent to all eligible electors on the Voter's List. The VILs will contain an individualized PIN number, telephone number to call and a designated internet address (URL) to access voting. Additionally, VILs will include instructions on how to vote, dates and hours of voting and the location and telephone number of the Voter Help Centre.
