Brush Curbside Collection

April 15 to 18 (Monday to Thursday)

& September 23 to September 26 (Monday to Thursday)

- Brush will be picked up the day prior to your regular garbage day during this week.
- Brush only will be picked up.
- Brush must not exceed 1.4 meters (4.5 feet) in length and must be bundled and • tied.

Yard Waste Curbside Collection

April 22 to 25 (Monday to Thursday)

- Yard waste will be picked up the day prior to your garbage day during this week.
- Yard waste must be placed in paper biodegradable bags and not exceed 20 kg (44 lbs).
- Yard waste in plastic bags will not be picked up.
- Includes such items as plant material, leaves and grass clippings.
- Please do not put plastic containers, seed flats, etc. in the bag.

Large Item (Bulk) Curbside Swap - New Initiative!

September 27, 28, 29 (Friday to Sunday)

- Residents are invited to place unwanted items curbside on the morning of Friday September 27th to Sunday the 29th to give others the chance to find a new home for your unwanted items prior to bulk waste collection.
- This program aims to divert items from the landfill site and offers another way to reuse items.
- Please do not place items on the curb prior to the days specified.

Large Item (Bulk) Curbside Collection

October 1 to 4 (Tuesday to Friday)

*Downtown businesses and apartments above businesses will be picked up

- on Tuesday, October 1 Items must be to the curb prior to 7:00 a.m. and will be picked up on your regular garbage day only.
- Items include household furniture such as couch, chair, table, mattress.
- Small items must be placed in a box or container, any glass must be taped, and please remove exposed nails or screws.
- If you are placing any container(s) to the curbside during this special collection that is not intended for disposal, please print your address clearly on the container in large letters.
- Refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners and any other item that contains freon must have a certificate noting that the freon has been removed by a licensed appliance dealer.
- Materials such as carpeting or hoses must be tied and not exceed 1.4 meters (4.5 feet) in length.
- Unacceptable Items Small appliances or electronics, construction and renovation material such as but not limited to drywall, wood, vanities, garage doors, concrete, propane tanks, tires, etc.

Please note that waste collection for the months of February, March, May, June, July and August follow the regular pick-up schedule and do not have special waste management programs.

Fall Leaf Collection

October 28 to November 22 (weather dependent)


There is no defined route, however several trips will be made throughout the Town during the specified dates.

The Town's preference is for residents to use bio-degradable paper bags for the curbside leaf collection. When leaves are raked to the curbside, they can plug the catch basins and cause ponding on the roadway during inclement weather.

WASTE BAG LIMITS

- Each residential unit is permitted a total of three untagged bags of garbage once weekly.
- One of the three untagged bags can be yard waste. Yard waste must be in a biodegradable bag.
- Additional bags over the untagged bag limit must be tagged.
- · Weight restriction of 20kg (44lbs) per bag.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS/ELECTRONICS AND WASTE

St. Thomas Community Recycling Centre 330 South Edgeware Road, St. Thomas

- Materials accepted free of charge include but are not limited to: paints and coatings, fluorescent bulbs/tubes, batteries, motor oil, electronics, including small appliances, scrap metal, pharmaceuticals, tires, cardboard.
- Materials accepted for a fee include but are not limited to: large (bulky) household items, construction and demolition materials, shingles, concrete, brick/blocks, clean wood and appliances containing refrigerant. All loads are charged by weight with a minimum charge of \$25.00.

BLUE BOX ITEMS PAPER PRODUCTS



- Magazines, catalogues, phone books
- Newspapers, flyers
- Egg cartons, cardboard boxes, pizza boxes

Cardboard must be flattened and bundled to no larger than 75 cm x 75 cm x 20 cm (30" x 30" x 8")

BLUE BOX ITEMS CONTAINERS

IF IT HOLDS A LIQUID, IT IS A CONTAINER

- Glass bottles, jars
- Plastics including clamshell containers
- Rigid plastic packaging #1-7
- · Cartons, drink boxes
- · Steel, aluminum, metal cans
- · Aluminum foil, foil pie plates
- Spiral wound containers
- Paper cups/lids
- Ice cream tubs, boxes and cartons
- · Empty metal paint cans (lids removed)
- · Empty aerosol cans (lids removed)

*Please rinse containers and detach lids where possible

DO NOT PUT IN THE BLUE BOX

- Plastic bags or plastic wrap
- Styrofoam, bubble wrap
- Wax or foil coated paper products
- Wrapping or dark coloured paper
- Broken glass or drinking glasses
- Light bulbs
- Metal coat hangers
- Pesticide and other hazardous waste containers
- Batteries, small appliances
- Pots and pans
